STOCKADE HILL, HOWICK

“Although Howick was initially a military settlement, there was no direct military action during the Waikato War of the 1860s. A stockade on Stockade Hill was built in 1863 in response to a perceived threat.

The Ngai Tai people, the tangata whenua (the local Maori people) of this area, supported the first European settlers, the members of the Royal New Zealand Fencible Corps and their families, and the Government. They assisted in building cottages and supplying fruit, vegetables, meat, fish, and shellfish to the early settlers. The Fencible soldier-settlers were placed in villages at Onehunga, Otahuhu, Panmure and Howick, and with a Maori militia at Takapuna and Mangere, gave protection to Auckland.

The Howick Stockade was constructed in July 1863 of loop-holed sheets of iron surmounting the ditch and bank. Three oblong buildings were erected within the stockade, as well as tents for the soldiers. Women and children from Howick and surrounding districts, were accommodated here for several weeks in late 1863. Members of the 70th Regiment and Bavarian mercenaries from Puhoi were stationed here in 1863.

Although a public meeting was held to acquire two canons for the two bastions, they were not required as peace returned, late in 1863.

The Stockade Hill War Memorial records those who died in action or service during World War I and World War II.”
