What's happening

We are working on a development plan to guide the future use and development of Huapai Recreation Reserve.

Huapai Recreation Reserve is a 16.5-hectare reserve located at 2A Tapu Road. The reserve was established in the 1980's as an active sports and recreation park for the Kumeū-Huapai area. Today, Huapai Recreation Reserve is still a sports park and is home to multiple sports clubs. The reserve also provides for passive recreation with two small playgrounds, a skate ramp, outdoor netball courts and adult fitness stations.

The aim of creating a development plan for Huapai Recreation Reserve is to deliver an inviting, inclusive park that supports a range of activities for everyone in our community, and celebrates its cultural heritage.

The proposed development plan takes into consideration:

- Renewal of the existing playgrounds
- Pedestrian and cycling routes
- Vehicle access and parking
- Maintaining current sports provision
- Drainage and biodiversity goals


The plan also considers Waka Kotahi NZTA's future Northwest Rapid Transit Corridor project, and the parkland that may be lost on the southern part of the reserve due to these proposals. The development plan will be used to inform ongoing discussions between Waka Kotahi and Auckland Council. We want to ensure the sustainability of proposed new park facilities via their strategic placement on the reserve.

This is your opportunity to have your say on the proposed plans, and to choose your preference for the playground upgrade.



• Reduce carpark size by the netball courts to enable the development of a destination play facility • Overall parking provision is improved. Current provision: 172 spaces, proposed provision: 200









The existing playgrounds at Huapai Recreation Reserve are scheduled for renewal in 2024/2025 because of their age and the deteriorating quality of the play equipment. They are to be upgraded as a destination playground, as identified in the Rodney Local Board Play Provision Assessment.

The upgraded playground should take advantage of the area's local history. Three themes are proposed that reflect the site and its surrounds:

Option 1:

'Urban Sports Bowl'

Huapai Recreation Reserve has always been considered a significant sporting facility for the Rodney district, with official field and clubroom development taking place in the late 1980's.

- The playground is a place to race, jump, move, spin, compete, be active mimicking the active recreation in the rest of the park
- Opportunity to provide for games and competition, as well as informal / unprogrammed play
- Opportunity to integrate Māori games and narratives
- Opportunity to include education around health benefits of physical activity
- Materials would be mainly steel, rope, rubber surfacing and astroturf in bright and bold colours
- Planting could be a combination of natives and exotics to soften the playground into the surrounding landscape.

A destination playground is a larger playspace which can accommodate lots of people. It caters to all ages/abilities, and offers specialised play activities. People will travel from around Auckland to visit, and spend longer periods of time here. Usually associated with destination playgrounds are also toilets, shade, picnic/BBQ spaces, drinking fountains and seating.

Option 2: 'Ecological Escape'

Kumeū River is a prominent river in the area and is located north of Huapai Recreation Reserve. The river formed Te Tōangaroa portage route, an important historic link between Kaipara and Waitematā Harbours.

- The playground is a place to **seek refuge, navigate, discover, splash, balance, slide** - mimicking a natural river environment
- Opportunity to provide for imaginative play, as well as informal / unprogrammed play
- Opportunity to include water play as a safe, interactive 'splash' component
- Opportunity to integrate Māori fishing and navigational methods, and narratives
- Opportunity to include education around the ecological importance of our waterways and native biodiversity (aquatic plant and animal species)
- Materials would be mainly natural with water, timber, stone, bark, sand, rope in muted tones of greens, blues, browns
- Planting could include native lowland species, hardy shrubs and groundcovers.

Option 3:

Huapai loosely translates to 'good fruit' in Māori, and the Kumeū-Huapai area is well known for it past and present fruit growing.
