

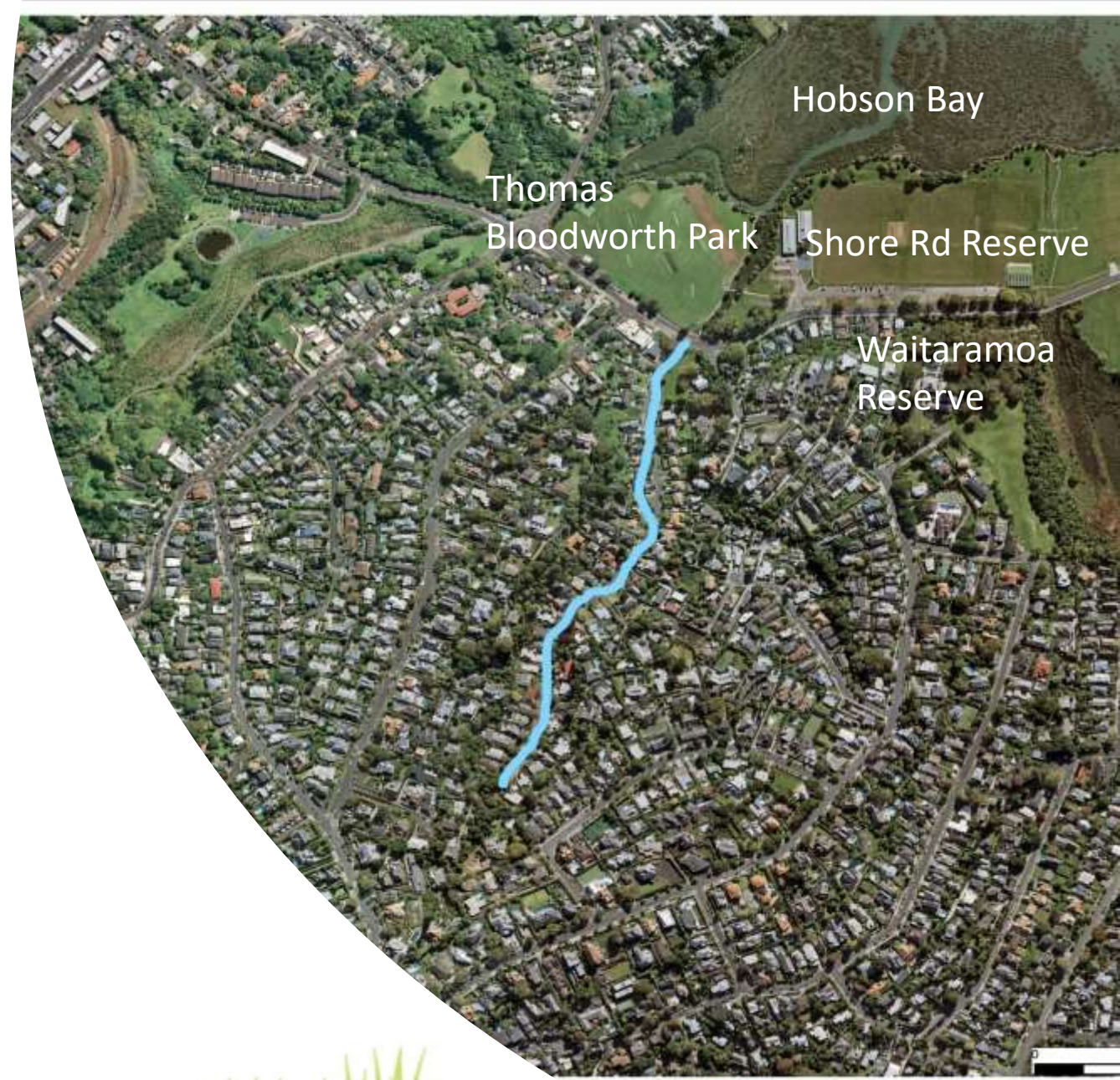
Backyard Bliss

- Community project awareness

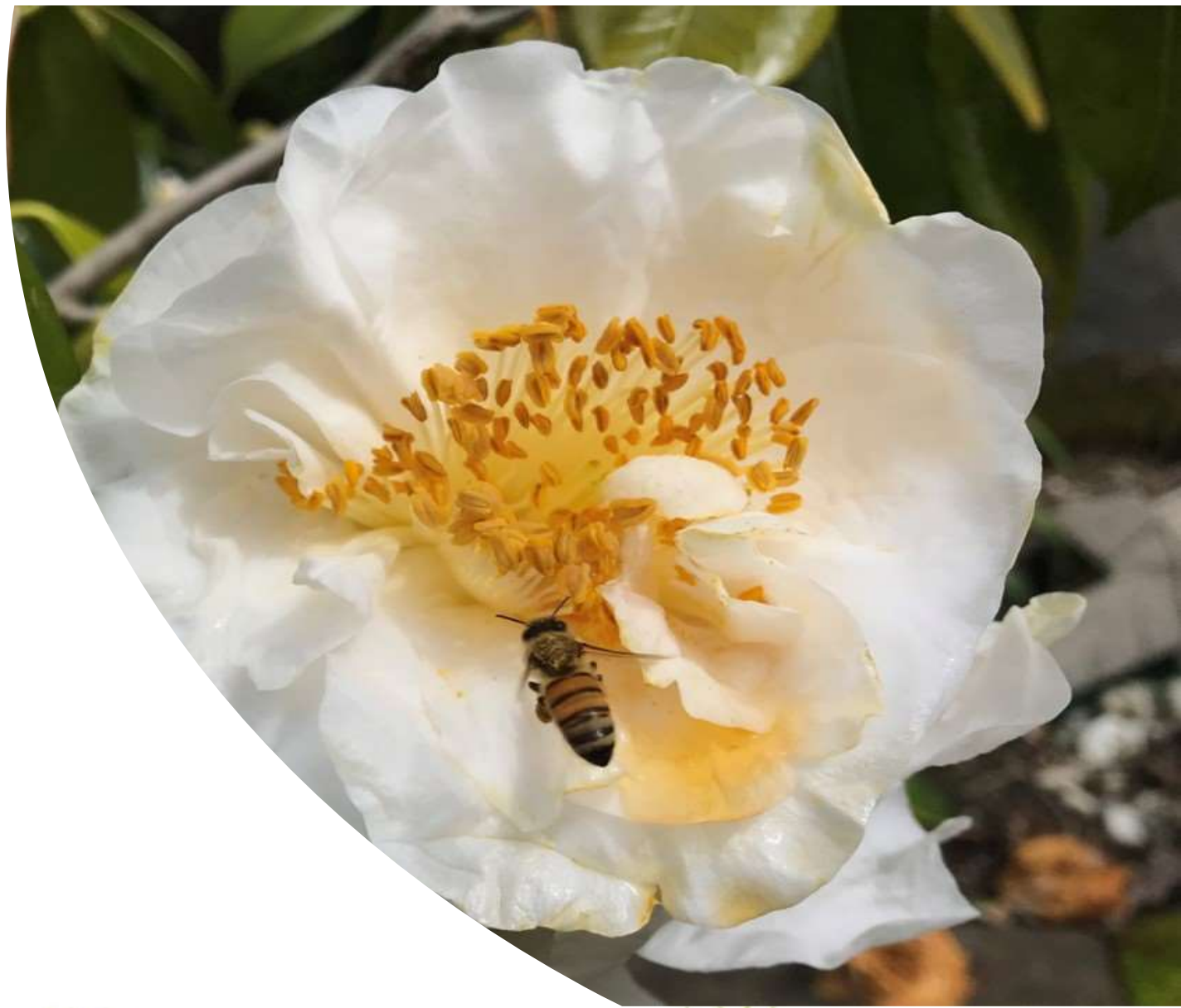


What made us successful?

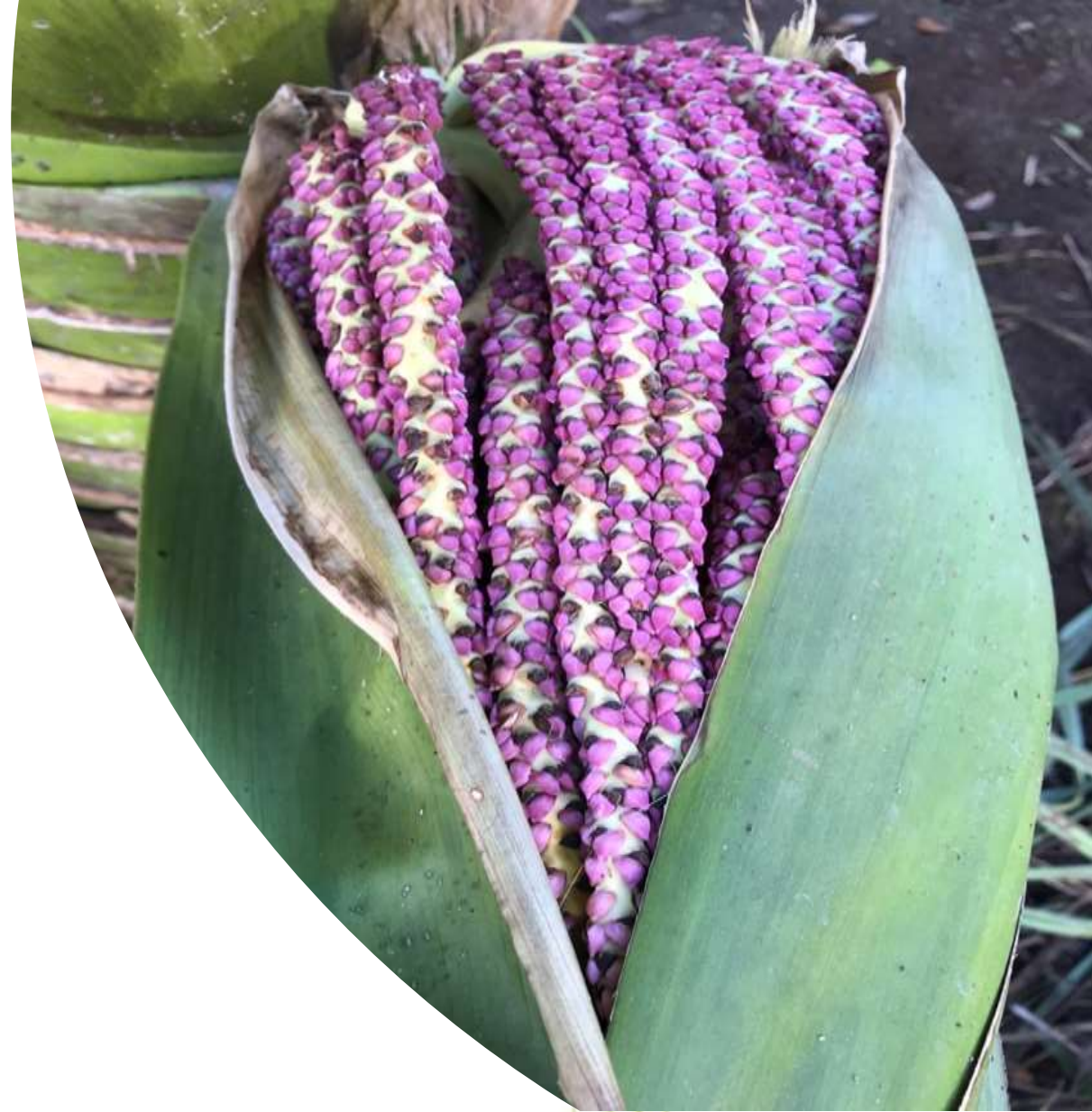
- We already came together - Street Party's
